During an activation it is imperative that we follow instructions so that traffic can be passed efficiently and accurately.
In the event of a repeater failure, please switch to the 146.880 Repeater (Memory 7).
Pause and unkey to allow the repeater to reset

I will first take check-ins from members of ARES®; I will then take non-members.
Members should check-in by saying their Unit Number, followed by their Call. It is NOT necessary to say "Net Control" and pause firstJust give your Unit Number and Call.

2 I will now take member check-ins starting with units 16 thru 30 Acknowledge check-ins by member #. Then ask "Any more from this group.?"
3 I will now take member check-ins starting with units 31 thru 45. Acknowledge check-ins by member #. Then ask "Any more from this group.?"

6 I will now take member check-ins starting with units 76 thru 90. Acknowledge check-ins by member #. Then ask "Any more from this group.?"
7 I will now take member check-ins starting with units 91 and up. Acknowledge check-ins by member #. Then continue to the next group.
Identify: This is (call sign), Net Control of the ARES® Net.
8 – ASK: Are there any LATE check-ins of ARES® members? Acknowledge late check-ins.
9 I will now take check-ins from operators who are not members of our ARES® Team. Please check-in by giving your Call Sign and First Name. <i>Acknowledge check-ins</i> .
10 – ASK: Does anyone have a bulletin or announcement for the net? Have operators give their bulletins or announcements.
11 Call on the Emergency Coordinator (Steve Smith W9GPI) for his comments.
12 – ASK: Does anyone have a question for the Emergency Coordinator? If yes, acknowledge the operator (s) and have them ask their questions.
13 – ASK one last time: Are there any more LATE check-ins? Acknowledge late check-ins.
Take a minute to gather the number of check-ins and total time taken, then
14 – Prepare an ARRL Radiogram showing yourself as Net Control Station and reporting the number of check-ins and the total time of the net from start to completion. (See Radiogram Sample.)
15 – Call W9GPI and pass the Radiogram to him.
