## Instructions for Lee County, FL, ARES® Situation Report

The idea is to send the maximum amount of information with the minimum amount of words.

The SITREP does not have to be "precise" we only need a first-hand overview of the situation in your area. There will be more detailed SITREPS provided by National Guard Helicopters, Law Enforcement, Fire Departments and Red Cross Representatives.

Amateur Radio operators are encouraged to update their SITREPS as more information becomes available. (Always from "reliable sources" of course...watch out for rumors or reports from citizens that have not actually been able to personally view the conditions on the ground.)

So, here's an example (refer to the Form), based on the possible situation following a Cat 4 Hurricane:

The surrounding area is flooded with water about 2' deep. The storm has left many surrounding homes with shingles / tiles missing or damaged and some homes with severe damage from falling trees or wind-blown debris. The reports I have from neighbors are that most roads are blocked with debris. Power is out. I have no Internet. I can't get a cell signal. I do have running water. I am available for deployment, but not until tomorrow.

**So, my SITREP would be:** 2 (two feet); 4B; 5A; 6; 8; 9; 11 (one day.)

Note: Where there are multiple choices (as in #4 and #5) pick the single best item. Do not report more than one choice.
