Two large tents in the south parking lot behind the EOC. These were used as barracks for some of the National Guard Troops and for Emergency Mangement Teams that came in from outside Lee County to help with the recovery. There was also a fuel truck which dispensed gasoline into vehicles as needed.

There were about 150 people in the EOC SitRoom at any given time, including overnight.

Emergency Mangement Teams came from several counties and served to relieve our own EM Staff starting the day after the Storm. Four days in, this allowed our EM crew to go home and unwind from their 12 (and sometimes 24 hour) days.
